Its as easy as 1, 2, 3!

Persistent Links

Some of the full-text article databases that the library subscribes to provide “persistent” links. “Persistent” means that:

- > the link will not change,
- > the necessary authentication code is built into the url for copyright compliance,
- > and when using the links, your students will have immediate access to selected articles right from your online course materials.

In EbscoHost

1. Identify the link: “Persistent link to this article (PermaLink)”
2. Copy the URL: Simply highlight the link and copy [Ctrl-C]
3. Make a New Link in D2L: Paste the info into the URL line [CTRL-V]



In WilsonWeb

1. Identify the link: “Persistent URL”
2. Copy the URL: Right-click on the link, click on Properties, highlight the url (SCROLL down to capture the entire url), then copy [Ctrl-C]
3. Make a New Link in D2L : Paste the info into the URL line [Ctrl-V]



In ProQuest - To be copyright compliant, you must ADD the ezproxy url for authentication)

1. Identify the Link – “Durable link”
2. Copy the URL: Click on Copy link, highlight the url, then copy [Ctrl-C]
3. Make a New Link in D2L
 - a. Type: <http://ezproxy.lib.uwstout.edu:2048/login?url=>
 - b. Paste the durable link immediately after – *no spaces*

Electronic Course Materials
