Taking an online course

You may participate using your home or another computer to access the course Web pages, modules, and readings. Many of the course instructional concepts are developed through participating in an online class forum called a discussion board. The discussion board is used to dialog with your online peers about readings, exchange ideas and share information and resources, and respond to case studies posted by peers or your instructor.

Meet Your Instructor . . .

Dr. Sharon Giroux is a Professor in the Department of Hospitality and Tourism at the University of Wisconsin-Stout in Menomonie, Wisconsin. Dr. Giroux serves as advisor to undergraduate and graduate students on campus and was named as the Gaming Management Advisor for students enrolled in the Gaming Management Certificate and Minor Programs on campus. Sharon has an established history working with Native people in several communities and currently serves as the University Representative to NATOW (Native American Tourism of Wisconsin) association.



Tuition:

This program consists of four 3-credit courses with the tuition of \$350.00 per credit, \$1,050.00 per course, and a total of \$4,200.00 for the entire Certificate program. Tuition reimbursement may be available from your employer, tribe, or other community resources.

*This is the approved tuition rate for September 1, 2008 - August 31, 2009 (tuition rate is reviewed on an annual basis).

To Apply:

Participants must apply, meet all program requirements, and receive notice of acceptance before registering. Class size is limited to 20 participants. Eligible students will be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. All applicants will be notified of their status within 2-3 weeks after receipt of all documents. Applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis.
