To be admitted with full status, applicants must hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited college and an overall grade point average of 2.75. Generally an applicant's bachelor degree is in a career and technical education area. Education and work experience are evaluated by the program director. Applications lacking the desired background or having a GPA of 2.25 may be admitted on probation.

Degree Requirements

The degree requires the completion of at least 30 semester hours of graduate credits with an overall grade point average of 3.0 or better. A minimum of 15 credits must be in courses at the 700-800 level.

Credit Transfer

Ten graduate level credits may be transferred into the program with preapproval from the program director. Approval should be obtained in advance to determine applicability of the proposed coursework. Transfer of credit is made only after admission to the degree program and is based upon receipt of official grad transcripts showing successful completion of the course.

Tuition

Tuition is currently approved at \$430.00 per graduate credit for the 2007-08 school year and is subject to yearly increases. Tuition may be paid by check, money order, school purchase order, Mastercard or Visa credit cards. Travel and personal expenses will vary depending on your proximity to the classroom.

Financial Aid

If you are interested in financial aid, file a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Be sure to list University of Wisconsin-Stout so that your results will automatically be sent to our university.
