## GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

Each degree program has a general education component designed to provide you with knowledge and skills in communication, analytic reasoning, health and physical education, humanities and the arts, social and behavioral sciences, natural sciences and technology. General education courses are listed by category and area. Not all courses are offered each semester. Changes to the list of courses can occur at any time.

### ETHNIC STUDIES REQUIREMENTS

The university requires that you take ethnic studies courses to learn about the diverse cultural that make up the United States. Ethnic studies courses are identified as ESA, ESB, or ESC. ESA courses deal directly with an American culture. ESB courses integrate appreciation and understanding of American cultural groups into course subject matter. ESC courses include a significant multicultural component secondary to other course goals. Students are required to take either:

- 1) Two ESA courses *or*
- 2) One ESA course and one ESB course, *or*
- 3) One ESA course and two ESC courses, *or*
- 4) One ESB course and two ESC courses, *or*
- 5) Three ESB courses, *or*
- 6) Two ESB course and one ESC course
