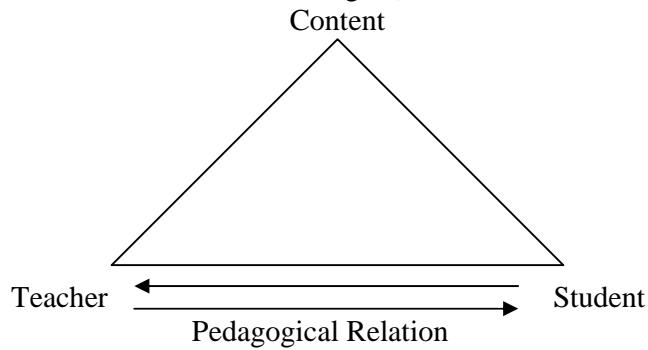
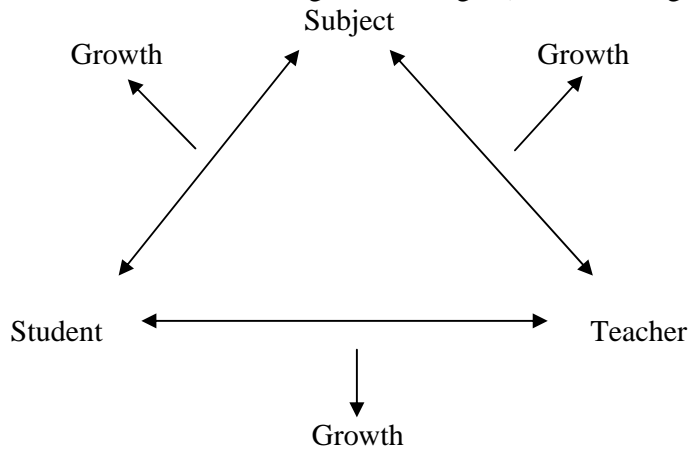

<sup>1</sup> This note serves to point out my use of the adjective 'didactical' instead of 'didactic' as used by the authors to qualify the triangle of teaching-and-learning.
