The Blue Devils will play in the Missouri Southern Classic, and are scheduled to take on Division II teams Missouri Southern and Pittsburg State, NAIA foes Huron University and Evangel University, as well as Division III opponents, William Penn and St. Olaf. **Last week:** The Blue Devils opened their season with a sweep over the University of Dubuque, March 4, at the Metrodome. Stout had little trouble in the opener, taking a 4-0 win, but had to come from behind in the bottom of the seventh for a 6-5 win over the Spartans. **Pitcher of the week:** Matt Lunde, Sr, Eau Claire, Wis.; **Position player of the week:** Brad Barneson, Sr, Strum, Wis.

VERDEGAN, LUER BOTH SNAG THIRDS AT NATIONAL TRACK MEET

ADA, Ohio - UW-Stout's **Laura Verdegan (So, Tony)** and **Jenney Luer (Sr, Colfax)** placed third in their respective events at the NCAA Division III Track and Field Championships, Saturday, March 9 at Ohio Northern University in Ada, Ohio.

Luer closed out her collegiate indoor career with her first All-America award, tossing the shot put 45-feet, 10.50-inches. Luer out-tossed Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) champion, Tabitha Fendrick of UW-Whitewater, who placed eighth with a throw of 44-2.75. Healy Thompson of Williams College won the event with a distance of 47-4.25.

Verdegan, competing in only her second meet of the season, extended her own school record in the triple jump, erasing the old mark of 38-3.50 with a jump of 38-4.75 to earn her first indoor, but second, All-America award. Verdegan placed third at the 2001 outdoor championships in the triple jump. Verdegan, who placed second at the conference meet in the triple jump last weekend only three days after the completion of Stout's basketball season where she is a starting forward, outpaced UW-Oshkosh's and WIAC champion Jill Kincaid, who jumped 37-10.50 to finish sixth. Shimera Daniels of Wheaton, Mass, won her second consecutive triple jump title, this time setting a new Division III mark of 40-10.50.

As a team, Stout placed 11th, the Blue Devils' highest finish ever at nationals, with 12 points. UW-Oshkosh was second (37 pts), UW-La Crosse third (30.5), UW-Superior 20th (8), UW-Stevens Point 27th (7), UW-River Falls 40th (4), UW-Eau Claire 47th (3), and UW-Whitewater 57th (1). Wheaton, Mass, won the team title.

The Blue Devils will begin their outdoor season Saturday, March 16 when they compete at Point Loma Nazarene in San Diego, Calif.

JEFF ROTERING PLACES THIRD AT NATIONAL IN POLE VAULT

ADA, Ohio - UW-Stout's **Jeff Rotering (Sr, Waumandee)** placed third in the pole vault at the NCAA Division III Indoor Track and Field Championships, Friday, March 8 at Ohio Northern University in Ada, Ohio. Rotering cleared 15-feet, 11-inches to grab his first All-America award. Jeremy Scott of Allegheny College set a new NCAA Division III record with a jump of 18-0.50 to take top honors, snapping UW-La Crosse's Mike Schnurr's record jump of 17-4.25 from 1996. The Blue Devils' **Dave Hanson (Jr, Sun Prairie)** did not qualify to the final rounds in either the 55-hurdles or the 400-meter dash, which were run 25 minutes apart. Hanson was fourth in his heat and 13th overall in the hurdles (7.82) and second in his heat and 11th overall in the 400 (50.27). Basil Steele of Dubuque and Shawn Levinson of the College of New Jersey each finished in 7.57 for top times in the hurdles. Andrew Rock of La Crosse turned in a time of 48.25 in the 400 to pace the field. Rotering's six points placed Stout 25th. UW-La Crosse won the team title (54 pts), UW-Oshkosh was fifth (26), UW-Whitewater ninth (17), UW-Eau Claire 11th (16), UW-Stevens Point 18th (10), and UW-Platteville 22nd (8).

TASHA PASCH QUALIFIES TO THE NATIONAL GYMNASTICS MEET

ST. PETER, Minn - UW-Stout's **Tasha Pasch (Jr, Northfield, Minn)** has qualified to the National Collegiate Gymnastics Association (NCGA) Championships on the uneven bars and the floor exercise. Pasch will be making her third consecutive trip to the national meet. Last year, the Blue Devils qualified to the national event as a team and Pasch earned All-America honors, placing fifth on the vault and eighth in the all-around. As a freshman, Pasch earned All-America honors in the all-around, placing sixth. This marks the first time Pasch has advanced individually to the national meet on the bars or the floor. The 2002 NCGA Championships will be held March 22-23 at Ithaca, NY, College.

GYMNASTS WRAP UP SEASON AT MIDWEST REGIONALS

ST. PETER, Minn - With their second best team score of the season, UW-Stout wrapped up their season at the Midwest Regionals at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minn., Friday, March 8. The Blue Devils scored a 170.50, second only to a 172.575 in January, but still finished eighth of eight teams in the regionals. Gustavus Adolphus edged out defending national champion UW-La Crosse by less than a half point.

Tasha Pasch (Jr, Northfield, Minn) will find out Monday if she advances to the National Collegiate Gymnastics Association (NCGA) championships, March 22-23 at Ithaca College in Ithaca, N.Y. Pasch had Stout's top finish in all five events, but broke the top 10 in only two events - the all-around, where she placed seventh (35.95), and on the uneven bars, where she placed ninth (8.70). Pasch was 13th on the floor (9.25), 17th on the balance beam (8.925) and 17th on the vault (9.075). **Lacey Schroedl (Fr, Minneapolis, Minn)** was 19th on the vault (9.050).

BLUE DEVIL BASEBALL OPENS SEASON WITH A SWEEP

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn - One was never seriously in doubt, the other was a nailbiter, but UW-Stout opened the 2002 baseball season with a sweep over the University of Dubuque at the Metrodome in Minneapolis, Minn., Monday, March 4. Trailing 5-4 in the bottom of the seventh of the second game, pinch hitter **Jon Kroening (So, Ladysmith)** drove in the tying and winning runs with a single to centerfield to give Stout (2-0) a 6-5 win. In the opener, **Matt Lunde (Sr, Eau Claire)** went the distance and record eight strikeouts to record a 4-0 shutout.

In the second game, Stout entered the seventh inning trailing 5-2, but Brad Barneson (Sr, Strum), who went 4-for-6 on the day, crushed a lead-off ground rule double to center field. Barneson came home on a triple by **JW Dachel (Sr, Bloomer)** and Dachel scored on **Justin Biever's (Jr, South Milwaukee)** single, sending the Spartan pitcher to the showers. **Jake Riek (So, Boyceville)** reached safely on a throwing error on his sacrifice bunt. **Adam Acker (Jr, Minnetonka, Minn)** moved **Brad Kaul (So, Hartford)**, who was running for Biever and Riek on a sacrifice bunt, setting the table for Kroening. Stout scored first in the contest when **Nick Kalina (Sr, Potosi)** led off the first with a triple, then was plied by **Brock Meyer's (Jr, Lyle, Minn)** groundout. The Spartans took over the lead in the second inning with three runs, set up by a Stout throwing error. Stout added a single run in the fourth to pull to within 3-2 when Barneson tripled, then scored on a wild pitch. Dubuque (1-7) added two more runs in the top of the seventh, with help from Stout's second throwing error. Starting pitcher **Adam Rothenbuhler (Sr, Trego)** got knocked out of the game when he collided with Barneson going for a chopper off the artificial surface. **Nick Jones (So, La Crosse)** picked up the win in two-thirds of an inning. Rothenbuhler had nine strikeouts in 7.1 innings, and allowed five runs, four earned. Stout had two hits in the first six innings and notched five runs in the seventh.

Lunde had a perfect game going through the first three innings before the Spartans' Cory Parr connected on his first of two hits in the fourth inning of the opener. Lunde held Dubuque scoreless until the seventh when Parr reached again, then moved to second on Brett Firzloff's two out single. Lunde struck out the final batter looking. Stout got all of their hits and runs in the first three innings. Barneson led off the second with a triple, then came home on Dachel's in-the-park homer. Following an out, **Matt Hoelt (Jr, Elk Mound)** doubled, then came home on **Jim Foreman's (So, Apple Valley, Minn)** single. Stout's final run came in the top of the third. Kalina reached on a lead off single, stole second, then came home on a single by Barneson.

Stout is off until they head to Missouri for their annual spring break trip, March 17-22 in Joplin, Mo.

BLUE DEVIL FASTPITCH COMFORTABLE WITH YOUNG TEAM

MENOMONIE - Rebuilding is not a good way to look at the 2002 UW-Stout softball season. Rather building around is the preferred term for the Blue Devils fastpitch team that returns only five players from last year's squad.

But fourth year coach Chris Stainer is comfortable with her team that includes one senior, one junior, five sophomores and 11 freshmen.

"We have a small number of returners, absolutely," Stainer said. "But what role models these five returners are. I am proud that they have stuck it out and they are directing the young kids in a great way."

The Blue Devils, who finished last year at 21-24, return senior infielder **Sarah Kokke (Galesville)**, junior outfielder **Sara Jensen (Eau Claire)**, sophomore infielder **Kim Caswell (Stanley)**, sophomore catcher **Michele Harvieux (Centerville, Minn)** and sophomore outfielder **Carrie Ruda (Merrillan)**.

Kokke, a team captain along with Harvieux, is one of those players that has bounced around from the infield to the outfield to back to the infield, demonstrating her versatility.

"Sarah is a great leader on and off the field," Stainer said. "She has always been talented, but now she has finally gained confidence where she believes in her abilities."

Kokke will be either at second or third base and is looked to be the No. 3 hitter, because she has demonstrated the ability in the clutch to deliver with runners on.

Caswell demonstrates athleticism, Stainer said and is looking at either shortstop or second base.

"Kim makes those extreme plays look easy," Stainer said. "Defense is her strong suit, but she has made great strides offensively."

At the plate, given the right pitch, Caswell is able to hit for power.

Jensen saw time mostly as a pinch runner last season, but will see time in the outfield, where her skills have "grown by leaps and bounds" Stainer said.

While she has a strong arm, Stainer said Jensen's key attribute is her ability to get a read on the ball off the bat.

Harvieux was primarily the designated hitter last year, hitting at a .255 clip. Harvieux has the inside track as the team's catcher

Of the five returners, Ruda has seen the most playing time, starting 12 games at right field. Ruda, who started out her Stout career as a catcher, has a strong arm.

"I can't wait until someone tries to round third on her," Stainer said. "Carrie has come a long ways. She has become an extreme student of the game, re-teaching herself everything and it is definitely paying off.."

Ruda made only 12 appearances at the plate last year and has worked on her bat, becoming a switch hitter.

Much of the college fastpitch game begins with the pitching staff, and this year Stainer has the luxury of four pitchers, although all are making their debuts on the college field.

Molly Kraft (Fr, St. Louis Park, Minn) is very strong and accurate, said Stainer, and has the mentality of an upperclassman.

"Molly puts on her game face," Stainer said. "She is a thinking pitcher, which is always a threat."

Laura Bohn (Fr, Stoughton) has speed and the ability to move the ball, said Stainer, but is recovering from a preseason injury. **Leslie Barkin (Fr, Buffalo Grove, Ill)** is Stout's only lefthander and has a solid drop ball. **Nicky Mansur (So, Plover)** is a strong, hard working pitcher who has been away from the game for a couple of years while she went to technical college, but has a different outlook at the game because she coached her alma mater's junior varsity squad.

Stainer sees a group of pitchers that is very disciplined and, while not overpowering, are able to work the ball.

"Defensively, we are a stronger team than last year," Stainer said, adding the team behind the pitcher should help carry the young mound staff.

While Harvieux is pencilled in at the catcher spot, converted third baseman **Jamie Gorges (Fr, New London)** has been making a strong case at the spot, picking up the mechanics of wearing the mask and running the defense.

Erin O'Connell (Fr, Altoona) has been leaving an impression at first base, both with her glove and her bat. **Heather Novalany (Fr, Cottage Grove, Minn)** is a utility infielder who is more than capable at first, as well.

Kokke and Caswell are battling for the second base spot, but both could wind up at different spots. Caswell has a good shot at shortstop and Kokke could return to third base.

Kaela Wold (Fr, Altoona) has a strong arm and is very fluid at shortstop.

Novalany and **Kaylene Hanson (Fr, Black River Falls)** are also candidates at third base.

In center field, **Scooter Aspen (So, Eau Claire)**, a transfer from Minnesota-Mankato, appears to have locked down the spot.

"Scooter is a very aggressive ball player," Stainer said. "She has no fear in throwing a runner out at first. Scooter is so quick, even if she gets a bad jump, she could still get to the ball."

Aspen is very quick on the base paths as well, said Stainer, and is looking to tally a few stolen bases.

Backing Aspen up will be **Liz Riebe (Fr, Grafton)**, who is also extremely fast. Riebe can be utilized as a pinch hitter or pinch runner.

Also in the outfield will be **Andrea Boyle (Fr, Blaine, Minn)** and **Sky Flanders (Fr, Spring Valley)**. Boyle came to the Blue Devils as a second baseman, but appeared to have the natural ability of an outfielder. Flanders has been injured, but had a good fall season and is improving daily. She will challenge Jensen at left field.

While the coaching staff will have to wait and see about the hitting part, they have a pretty good idea what they will do when they get on base.

"I see us pushing our opponents more while on base," Stainer said. "Our team as a whole is extremely quick."

Two years ago, the Blue Devils easily led the league in stolen bases, doubling up on the team that finished second in steals.

To say that Stainer is looking forward to the season is an understatement.

"I see some great chemistry here," Stainer said. "and I think they will push each other. They are asking questions and are eager to learn. Coaching is fun. I just get to coach."

The Blue Devils will open their season with a spring break trip to the Bahamas where they will play 10 exhibition games. The exhibition schedule will give Stainer and her staff the chance to try out different combinations.

"We can go down there, make mistakes and leave them there," Stainer said.

Stout will open their NCAA schedule Thursday, March 28 when they travel to Winona State. Stout will open their home schedule Wednesday, April 3 when they host UW-Eau Claire.
