The Blue Devil men's basketball team (3-3, 0-1) host UW-River Falls (2-4, 0-1), Wednesday, Dec. 5 at 7 p.m. and travel to UW-Oshkosh (5-0, 1-0), Saturday, Dec. 8 at 3 p.m. Stout and River Falls split their contests last year, with both teams winning on their own floor. The eighth ranked Blue Devils hockey team (10-1-1, 3-1-0 NCHA, 2-1-0 WIAC) will close out the first semester of play by traveling to St. Norbert College (7-1-1, 3-0-1), Friday, Dec. 7 at 7 p.m. and at Lake Forest College (1-9-1, 0-4-0), Saturday, Dec. 8 at 3 p.m. The Blue Devils last year went 1-1-1 with St. Norbert, tying the Knights, 3-3, at home in December, defeating the Knights for the first time, 2-1, at the Resch Center, then losing to the Knights, 4-1, in the semi-finals of the NCHA playoffs. Stout swept both contests with Lake Forest, 5-2, 4-1. Both games will be audio streamed by St. Norbert and Lake Forest, respectively. BLUE DEVIL WOMEN'S BASKETBALL FALLS TO BLUGOLDS

MENOMONIE (December 1, 2007) - UW-Stout pulled to within four points early in the second half, rubbing out a 12 points halftime deficit, but could get no closer and the Blue Devils lost to UW-Eau Claire, 70-59, Saturday at Johnson Fieldhouse in the conference opener for both teams. Stout (3-4, 0-1) cut away at the 12 point deficit over the first four minutes of the second half, and trailed by four when **Tricia Van Vreede (Fr, Little Chute)** hit a jumper to trail 34-30. The Blugolds (5-1, 1-0) grabbed the six point lead on a bucket by Rachel Mueggenborg, but Stout got back to four points for the last time in the game when **Lindsey Geissler (Sr, Thorp)** drained to free throws. Geissler has not missed a free throw in 28 attempts this season, making all six of her attempts tonight. The Blugolds spurted out to a 10-point, 45-35 lead, going on 9-3 run as Kali Houselog scored five points in the run. Houselog, who finished with nine points, added two more free throws a minute later to take back the 10 point lead and Eau Claire never led by less than double digits the rest of the way. The Blugolds' Heather Witt led all scorers with 22 points. Heidi Arciszewski added 13 points and Michelle Burns, 10.

Stout was led by **Julia Hirssig (So, Rochester, Minn)** with 17 points, 12 in the second half. **Charlee Edwards (Jr, Danbury)** finished with 11 points. The Blue Devils shot 28.8 percent (17-of-59) from the floor, while Eau Claire connected on 46.9 percent (23-of-49). The loss was Stout's first conference loss at Johnson Fieldhouse since December, 2005. Stout will be at UW-River Falls, Wednesday, Dec. 5 and at UW-Oshkosh, Saturday, Dec. 8.

BLUE DEVILS CRUISE PAST NORTHLAND

MENOMONIE (November 28, 2007) - UW-Stout got off to an early 11-0 lead and never looked back, leading by at least nine the rest of the way, and defeating Northland, 69-48, Wednesday, at Johnson Fieldhouse. **Julia Hirssig (So, Rochester, Minn)** led the way for the Blue Devils (3-3, 0-0), posting her fourth double-double in six games this season. She finished with 19 points on 8-11 shooting from the field, 10 rebounds and 2 blocks. **Dani Boese (Jr, Alma)** added eight points for Stout on 3-7 shooting and also added a game-high three assists. **Charlee Edwards (Jr, Danbury)** finished with a game-high four steals, two of which came early, helping the Blue Devils get their early lead. For the Lumberjills (1-3), Chelsea Lundgren put up a double-double as well, scoring 16 points on 5-13 shooting from the field, and her 13 rebounds led all players. Jessica Graham also put up 16 points for Northland and, with nine rebounds, was just short of the game's third double-double.

STOUT MEN FALL TO EAU CLAIRE IN CONFERENCE OPENER

MENONONIE (December 1, 2007) - UW-Stout's seven game winning streak over UW-Eau Claire came to an end, Saturday, when the Blugolds defeated the Blue Devils, 72-63, at Johnson Fieldhouse to open conference play for both teams. After **Miles Webb's (Sr, Brooklyn Park, Minn)** layup with 12 minutes to play gave Stout (3-3, 0-1) a 41-39 lead - their first of the second half - four different Blugolds hit four straight three-pointers to help get back a 10-point lead. That margin was never less than five the rest of the way, and was increased to 12 at one point. Eau Claire's (4-2, 1-0) leading scorer was Dan Beyer, who dropped in 20 points to go with seven rebounds. Ryan Shea put up 17 points for the Blugolds, and Dan Mullen scored 11, shooting 3-6 from beyond the arc. Stout's **Alex Mason (Jr, St. Paul, Minn)** scored a personal season-high 20 points on 7-11 shooting, making both his attempts from downtown. **Jerrel Enerson-Matthews (So, Anoka, Minn)** and Webb both added 12 points for Stout.

Stout will resume play when they host River Falls Wednesday, Dec. 5, at Johnson Fieldhouse.

COACH BIRMINGHAM TO JOIN ESKRIDGE AT AZTEC BOWL

MENOMONIE (November 28, 2007) - Wisconsin-Stout defensive coordinator **Clayt Birmingham** will join Blue Devil defensive back **Wendell Eskridge (Sr, Milwaukee)** at the 2007 Aztec Bowl. The Aztec Bowl pits a Division III all-star team against the Mexican National Team. The coaching staff and team is selected by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the game will be Saturday, Dec. 8 in Chihuahua, Mexico.

Birmingham, who is in his first year as defensive coordinator at Stout, will be joined on the coaching staff by current and former Division III coaches J.R. Bishop (Wheaton), Wally Hood (Otterbein), Nick Mourouzis (DePauw), and Wayne Perry (Hanover), U.S. Head Coach Bill Manlove announced recently. Manlove is making his second head coaching appearance in the Aztec Bowl. One of the winningest coaches in college football history, Manlove served as an assistant coach on the U.S. staff in the 2002, 2003 and 2004 Aztec Bowls. In 32 years at Widener, Delaware Valley and La Salle, Manlove compiled a 212-110-1 record, including an impressive 182-53-1 record at Widener.

Birmingham is making his first coaching appearance in the Aztec Bowl. He completed his first season as defensive coordinator at the University of Wisconsin-Stout in 2007. Earlier this year he was a member of the coaching staff that led the United States to the gold medal at the 2007 World Championship of American Football in Kawasaki, Japan. Birmingham is the first Stout coach to coach at the Aztec Bowl. Bishop is making his fifth coaching appearance in the Aztec Bowl. He served as an assistant coach on the first U.S. team in 1997 in Toluca and returned to the staff in 2004. He spent 23 seasons at Wheaton from 1982-2004, the last nine as associate head coach and offensive coordinator. As Wheaton's head coach from 1982-95, Bishop guided the program to a record of 84-43-1. Wheaton had won just five games in the three years before his arrival.

Hood is making his fourth coaching appearance in the Aztec Bowl. In 24 seasons at Ohio Northern, Otterbein and Fairmont State, Hood compiled a 112-112-8 record. He earned Ohio Athletic Conference co-Coach of the Year honors in 1982 at Ohio Northern when he led the Polar Bears to a divisional championship. Mourouzis is making his third coaching appearance in the Aztec Bowl. In 23 seasons at DePauw, Mourouzis compiled a 137-87-4 record. He is the winningest coach in school history. The Miami (Ohio) graduate was inducted into the school's "Cradle of Coaches" in 2003, joining legendary coaches Woody Hayes, Paul Brown and Ara Parseghian among others. Perry is making his first coaching appearance in the Aztec Bowl. He retired at the end of the 2007 season after 26 seasons at Hanover College. He ended his career as the winningest coach in Indiana college football history with a record of 176-97-2. He led the Panthers to eight conference titles, nine NCAA/NAIA playoff appearances and four 10-win seasons.

STERNBERG GOAL LIFTS STOUT HOCKEY OVER BLUGOLDS

EAU CLAIRE (December 1, 2007) - **Andy Sternberg (So, Duluth, Minn)** scored the game winning goal with 29 seconds remaining in the game to lift UW-Stout to a 2-1 win at UW-Eau Claire Saturday at Hobbs Ice Arena. **Danny Ryan, Jr. (Fr, Niles, Ill)** dug the puck out of the corner and fed it to Sternberg who tickled the net and gave the Blue Devils (10-1-1, 3-1-0) a come-from-behind win. The Blugolds (4-5-0, 1-3-0) opened the scoring when Jesse Vesel scored on a power play in the first period. **Derek Hanson (So, Bemidji, Minn)** got the equalizer on the power play for the Blue Devils 29 seconds into the third period. **Jack Wolgemuth (Jr, Anchorage, Alaska)**, who also assisted on the game-winning goal, got an assist on Hanson's goal, along with **Joel Gaulrapp (So, Owatonna, Minn)**. **Matt Koenig (Jr, Lakeland, Minn)** picked up his 10th win of the season by making 33 saves. Tyler Brigl had 34 saves for the Blugolds.

BLUE DEVILS DOUBLE UP STEVENS POINT

MENOMONIE (November 30, 2007) - **Joel Gaulrapp (So, Owatonna, Minn)** scored two power play goals and UW-Stout doubled up on UW-Stevens Point, 6-3, Friday at the Dunn County Ice Arena in a physical battle. Each team scored at least one goal in each period and the teams tallied 25 penalties apiece. The Blue Devils (9-1-1, 2-1-0) were 4-for-8 on the power play, while the Pointers (5-3-0, 1-2-0) were 2-for-8. Gaulrapp scored what would prove to be the game-winning goal, getting the power play goal six minutes into the second period, on assists by **Jack Wolgemuth (Jr, Anchorage, Alaska)** and **David Larson (Fr, Warroad, Minn)**. Gaulrapp also scored the final goal of the game, coming with six minutes left in the game. Stevens Point got on the board first when Tim Manthey scored on a - what else? - power play goal only four minutes into the game, lifting the shot over Stout goalie **Matt Koenig's (Jr, Lakeland, Minn)** left shoulder. The Blue Devils tied the score only a bit more than a minute later on **Nick Klaren's (Jr, North St. Paul, Minn)** power play goal. Stout jumped out to a 2-1 lead when **Jake Erickson (Sr, Rochester, Minn)** got his first goal of the season, a shorthanded goal with six minutes remaining in the first period. Stout took a 3-1 lead a minute before the first break when **Danny Ryan (Fr, Niles, Ill)** scored, again on a power play. Gaulrapp put Stout up 4-1 early in the second, but the Pointers' Manthey picked up his second goal of the night at the 14 minute mark. Stout's **Scott Motz (So, Lake Elmo, Minn)** scored only 30 seconds later. The Pointers picked up their third goal of the night, this time midway through the third period on a Sean Fish power play goal. Gaulrapp ended the scoring with about five minutes remaining. Koenig finished the night with 37 saves, while Stevens Point's Marcus Paulson had 32 saves.

JOEL GAULRAPP REPEATS HONORS IN BOTH LEAGUES

MENOMONIE (November 26, 2007) - UW-Stout forward **Joel Gaulrapp (So, Owatonna, Minn)** scored two goals in the third period to give the Blue Devils a tie with St. Thomas last week. Gaulrapp was named the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association (NCHA) and the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) player of the week for the second time this season. Trailing 3-1 at the start of the third period, Gaulrapp scored two goals in the period to give Stout a 3-3 tie at No. 10-ranked St. Thomas on Nov. 20. He scored five minutes into the period to pull the Blue Devils within one goal, then tied the score with 54 seconds remaining in regulation. Gaulrapp currently ranks in the top five in the NCHA in goals (9, 3rd), assists (8, 5th), points (17, 2nd) and power play goals (4, 2nd).
