- Employment history (including military service) and dates of service (include a description of the role if necessary);
- c. Volunteer, practicum, internship and other relevant experiences.
- d. Other achievements or experiences to support your application.

#### IV. Written Personal Statement

Submit a separate document, a personal narrative that incorporates the following (3-pgs max., dbl-spaced) (online grad appl. statement is not also required, write "see attached" or similar):

- a. Describe your potential as a graduate student in school psychology, as well as your motivation for entering the program, including professional goals as you currently perceive them.
- b. Demonstrate an understanding of the roles and functions of the school psychologist as you currently understand it.
- c. Illustrate in concrete terms what you have done in the past (education, employment, volunteer or life experiences) that demonstrates interest in and commitment to children, learning, and/or vulnerable populations (eg, individuals with disabilities, disadvantaged youth)
- d. Describe any personal characteristics such as leadership experience/potential, which support your suitability to work with vulnerable populations in a professional helping role.
- e. Tell us how you learned of the School Psychology Graduate Program at the University of Wisconsin-Stout.

#### V. References

Obtain three (3) current and dated letters of reference from persons who are personally acquainted with your work skills, work behaviors and/or educational background. List references below. All reference letters should describe the applicant's abilities in the following areas:

- a. Overall attitude and potential to succeed in graduate studies
- b. Motivation and initiative
- c. Interpersonal skills and ability to relate to people
- d. Ability to work independently and as part of a team/group
- e. Critical thinking and reasoning skills
- f. Any potential areas of concern (performance or behavior) related to ability to work with vulnerable populations

NOTE: By including the names and contact information for recommenders you are waiving your right to review reference information once it becomes part of your admission file.

### VI. Required Background Check

- The University of Wisconsin system requires a background check as part of the application process for all degrees leading to licensure though the state Department of Public Instruction.
- b. In order to complete your application process, you will need to obtain a background check by following the link provided here (must be this link; we cannot accept forwarded results from prior background checks).
- c. There is a minimal cost associated with the process and results will be forwarded to our institution automatically by following the directions provided in the link below.
- d. It is worth noting that common minor and/or juvenile offenses will not be harshly scrutinized. Offenses that would be considered relevant to the application process at UW-Stout are those that would be inconsistent with one's ability to obtain an educator's license in the state of Wisconsin.
